As we come to the end of another busy and exciting week at Holy Trinity, I would like to say a huge thank you to Pastor Ruth from Hope Community Church for leading our Prayer Space this week. The children thoroughly enjoyed taking part in the different activities and it was wonderful to see them engaging so thoughtfully with opportunities for prayer, reflection and spirituality.

The activities were carefully linked to our school vision and our approach to developing spirituality through "Windows, Mirrors and Doors". The children explored windows that help us see the world and other people's perspectives, mirrors that encourage us to reflect on ourselves and our relationship with God, and doors that inspire us to think about how we can make a difference through our actions. It was a joy to see the children responding with such maturity, curiosity and enthusiasm.

Our Year 2 and Year 3 pupils have also been busy this week taking part in practical pedestrian training with the Hillingdon Road Safety Team. The children have been learning important skills to help them stay safe when out and about in the local community, and they represented the school brilliantly throughout the sessions.

This afternoon, we were delighted to welcome our local councillor, Henry Higgins, to Holy Trinity. He met with members of our School Council and was able to see first-hand the improvements that have been made to our library. We are incredibly grateful for the £1,500 contribution from his ward budget, which helped us create such a welcoming and inspiring reading space for our children.

How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

We made pirate maps to find numbered coins hidden around Nursery and built a pirate ship using large wooden blocks. As part of our RE learning, we discovered why some Muslim ladies wear a hijab and we also enjoyed a morning in the prayer space.

Maple

We explored the story of The Good Samaritan and discussed the importance of showing kindness and compassion to everyone, including people we may not know. The children shared thoughtful ideas about how they can help others and make a positive difference.

Oak

Oak Class have been thinking about how they can lead a more sustainable life. They learned about this in science and made bug hotels to encourage insects into their gardens. They also really enjoyed using the Prayer Space!

Ash

We enjoyed a lovely, sunny nature walk in science. We spotted lots of different wildlife in our local area. The children drew pictures to answer the question, 'What can we do for wildlife?'. They drew bird feeders and baths, log piles, bug hotels, wildflowers, and more.

Willow

Willow have had a wonderful week this week, completing pedestrian training, using the prayer space in several creative ways including using pipe cleaners to make the shape of a person whilst praying for them! and continuing to build our sewing skills.

Cedar

The children have been busy writing newspaper reports about the effects of plastic pollution, developing their research and writing skills. In RE, they gained a deeper understanding of liturgy through discussions with Rev. Ann.

Sycamore

We had a lovely visit to the Prayer Space this week - the children learnt about prayer and enjoyed exploring the many interactive activities on offer. In Geography, we used atlases to locate deserts around the world and learnt about the features of both hot and cold deserts.

Redwood

In Maths, we have started our Bakery Project, and we were also visited by members of the National Holocaust Museum, who helped us explore the story of Leo, a 10-year-old Jewish refugee, and learn about isolation, propaganda, and antisemitism.



Thought for the week



It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick...
I desire mercy, not sacrifice.
Matthew 9:12-13

When the religious leaders questioned why Jesus spent time with people who made mistakes, Jesus replied: "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick... I desire mercy, not sacrifice." (Matthew 9:12-13)

Jesus wasn't saying that some people are good and some people are bad. He was teaching us that nobody is perfect and that everyone needs kindness, forgiveness and support. Just as a doctor helps people when they are unwell, Jesus came to help people when they make mistakes, feel lost, or need a fresh start.

Sometimes it can be easy to judge others when they get something wrong. Jesus challenges us to do something different. He asks us to show mercy. Mercy means showing kindness, compassion and forgiveness, even when someone may not deserve it.

At school, we can live this out by helping someone who is struggling, forgiving a friend after a disagreement, including someone who feels left out, or choosing kind words when it would be easier to be unkind.

When we show mercy to others, we reflect the love that Jesus shows to us every day.

Something to pray

Dear God,

Thank you that you love each one of us, not because we are perfect, but because we are your children. Help us to show mercy and kindness to others, especially when they make mistakes. Teach us to forgive as you forgive us, to support those who are struggling, and to look for the good in everyone we meet.
