# How we have flourished this week!

## Seedlings and Acorns

We've been immersed in *The Gruffalo*. The children have enjoyed retelling the story using props and have created some wonderfully imaginative Gruffalo paintings. In RE, we have continued exploring how we can care for our world.

## Maple

This week, in RE, the children began learning about Islam and why a Mosque is a special place to Muslims. In Maths we were looking at repeating and continuing patterns. We also used some fantastic similes in our English work.

## Oak

We have been very busy in Oak Class this week. We have been skip counting in twos, tens and fives in maths and writing our own story about moving home in English. In science we were identifying common garden and wildflowers.

## Ash

Year 2 has done lots of measuring this week! We have measured many objects around the classroom and found the difference in length and height between some of them. We learnt that our classroom is more than 7 metres long! In PSHE we revisited the importance of staying safe on the internet.

## Willow

Willow have begun making our own 'papyrus' paper! We will use them to make our own Egyptian style scrolls! In Maths, we have moved on to learning about mass and capacity, learning some skills to help with our baking!

## Cedar

This week in Year 4, the children explored making a whole from tenths and hundredths. They also began learning to write poetry based on *The River* by Valerie Bloom, using figurative language such as metaphors and rhyme.

## Sycamore

This week in Year 5, we learned about Sikhi and the tradition of Langar in RE, where we made and shared a meal together. In science, we started planning an experiment to test air resistance on different sized parachutes. We also began our new writing unit on poetry.

## Redwood

In Science this week, we learned about the functions of blood. In PSHE, we explored Autism Acceptance Month and discussed how we can support and care for those around us. In RE, we learned about the Creed and how different Christians use it in their lives.



## Thought for the week



I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. *John 10:11*

This week, we reflect on what it means for Jesus Christ to be the Good Shepherd. A shepherd knows each of their sheep, cares for them, protects them, and guides them—even when the path is difficult.
