How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

The children in Nursery have made a fantastic start to the new half term and have jumped enthusiastically into our new topic; Animals! We have also been looking for early signs of spring and discussing the changes that come with the new season.

Maple

This week we began talking about Palm Sunday, using role play to retell the story. In Maths we started looking at odd and even numbers and in Music we learnt about tempo.

Oak

This week, Oak class have been learning all about the United Kingdom and the countries that make it up. In maths they have working on their place value up to 50 and

Ash

In English, we have started thinking about persuasive writing: Our whiteboard pens are going on strike and we must convince them to stay! We were comparing schools in the past to the present and thinking about timelines in history.

Willow

This week, willow began a new history topic, focusing on the Romans. We have enjoyed beginning to learn about the spread of the Roman Empire. In Music, we have been focusing on singing, listening carefully to each other and singing as part of a group.

Cedar

We have begun exciting new topics in Maths and English: in Maths, they are developing their understanding of fractions and partitioning mixed numbers; in English they are exploring adventure writing inspired by *The Explorer* by Katherine Rundell.

Sycamore

The children started their Joy of Movement sessions with Brentford FC, where they learned about the importance of physical activity. In Science, we began our new unit on Life Cycles, with the children focusing on mammals and their stages of development.

Redwood

This week in Geography, Year 6 compared how the US and the UK produce and use energy. The pupils also used four-figure grid references to locate key features on maps. In English, Year 6 began reading *Kensuke's Kingdom* and used evidence from the text to justify their predictions.

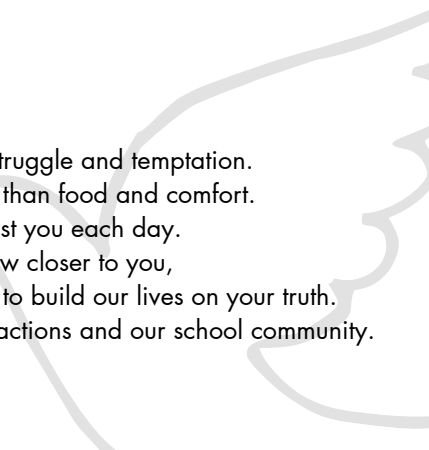
As a school community, we can use this season to root ourselves more deeply in God's word so that we can continue to grow and flourish together.
