UPDATE FROM MR SZURGOT

It has been another exciting and memorable week at Holy Trinity, with the school absolutely buzzing following a fantastic visit from the Pinner and Ruislip Beekeepers Association.

The children thoroughly enjoyed learning all about the important role bees play in our world. In EYFS and KS1, the children explored the life cycle of bees, while KS2 learnt more about pollination, nectar and how bees help plants to grow and thrive. One of the highlights of the visit was the opportunity for all children to see real bees safely inside an observational hive. They were also fascinated to explore parts of a large hive, handle beeswax and even see honey produced by the bees themselves. It was wonderful to see so much curiosity, excitement and thoughtful questioning from the children throughout the day.

There has also been great excitement in Nursery this week, with the sound of butterflies fluttering around as the children watched their caterpillars finally emerge from their cocoons. The children were delighted to carefully release the butterflies into the world around us, helping to support the pollination of the plants and flowers in our environment. These real-life experiences are such a valuable way for children to develop a deeper understanding and appreciation of the natural world.

We are also very excited to confirm that our Sports Day will take place on **Friday 26th June** at Northwood Cricket Club. It will follow the same successful format as last year, beginning with a family picnic on the grass at lunchtime before an afternoon full of fun sporting activities and team spirit. How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

This week in Nursery we have been very excited to see our butterflies emerge from their chrysalises. As part of our RE learning, acorns visited the church and had a tour with Reverend Ann. In Maths we have been looking at different patterns.

Maple

We enjoyed some thoughtful discussions about the importance of grandparents and the special memories and stories they share with us. The children loved hearing about how the world has changed since their grandparents were young.

Oak

In science, they used their skills of observation to look more closely at garden flowers and wildflowers. They then completed a small-scale survey, in the church yard, to collect data about the types and numbers of flowers within a given area.

Ash

In Ash Class, we have been finding and comparing the masses of different objects, using balance scales. We have also been learning to read analogue weighing scales. In art, we made mosaic pictures, inspired by ancient tradition, and our music lesson was brilliant recorder practice!

Willow

This week, Willow have begun reading a new text in English, entitled 'The Gardener' by David Small. As part of our experience day, we planted some bulbs and learned about the need to soak them, prior to planting, to bring them out of hibernation.

Cedar

We have been exploring how plants can be grouped by closely examining their different features and characteristics. In RE, we have continued to develop our understanding of Buddhism by learning about key beliefs and practices within the religion.

Sycamore

We have been looking at how to read and interpret line graphs, tables, two way tables and timetables. We have also looked at the different types of Islamic art and drew some beautiful patterns and we wrote a diary entry pretending we had attended a Sikh wedding.

Redwood

SATs are just around the corner! Redwood have been working through practice papers this week to practice their pace when completing the papers. In PE, children learned how to control their pace and speed during relay racing in Athletics.

Thought for the week



Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. *John 14:1*

Sometimes life can feel worrying or uncertain. We might feel nervous about friendships, tests, changes, or things happening around us. In this verse, Jesus reminds us that we do not have to carry those worries alone. He encourages us to trust in Him, even when things feel difficult or unclear.
