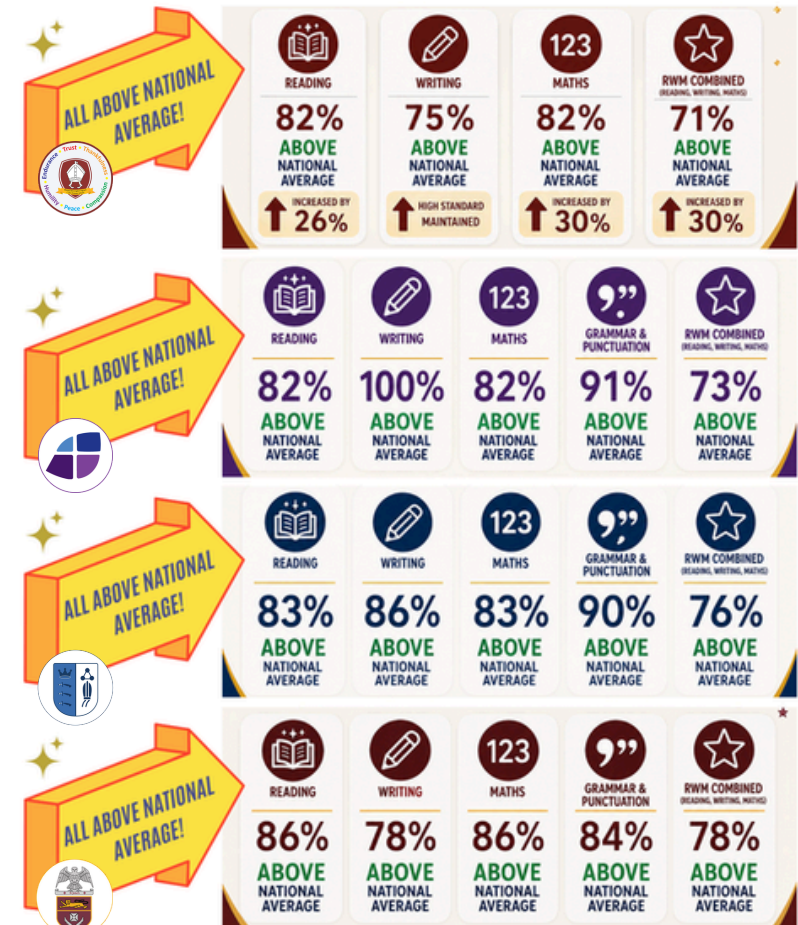

St John's Update

September marks an exciting new chapter for St John's as the school moves onto one single site. Over the past four years the school has carefully reduced its class sizes to 1 per year group in response to falling pupil numbers across Harrow (in line with other local schools). From September, Reception to Year 3 classes will have a maximum of 30 pupils, allowing us to make the very best use of our facilities.

Access to the school will now be via the main Stanmore Hill entrance only. During the summer holidays new security gates will be installed, and children and families will be able to enter the site from 8.30am through a new pedestrian entrance. There will no longer be vehicle access to the car park during drop-off and collection times, helping to improve safety for everyone.

This year we have continued investing significantly in the learning environment. Every classroom has been redecorated, and new dedicated learning spaces have been created, including specialist small-group teaching areas and a new music room.

Work is now underway for our purpose built Nursery for 2 and 3 year olds and Reception classrooms. We expect this exciting new provision to be completed during the Spring Term. These designs include

- A quiet sensory space / sleeping areas
- Dedicated adult and children toilets
- A kitchen area
- Outdoor decking and learning environment
- Air conditioning
- A new pathway providing direct parent access from the playground
