How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

This week, we learnt about recycling, respecting God's world and the construction industry through the story 'Dig Dig Digging'. In Maths, we practised counting to 10.

Maple

This week we have been learning about the poet Valerie Bloom for Black History Month. We looked at her poem 'When mummy combs my hair' and learnt some actions to go with it. In Maths we were introduced to the new concept of repeating patterns.

Oak

This week Oak class have been learning about how the days in winter are shorter than the days in summer- a tricky concept to understand! They have been scientists by looking at the data for sunlight hours and producing a pictogram.

Ash

In English we have written brilliant non-chronological reports to complete our unit on 'Big Cats' which the children have loved! In science we learnt about food chains using the key words 'producer', 'prey' and 'predator'. We were each assigned an animal or plant from different habitats and had to get into order.

Willow

This week, Willow have continued learning about Skara Brae. We have found it fascinating to learn about the lives of people in the Stone Age this half term. In art, we added colour to our 'cave' drawings, ensuring we used only naturally found colours.

Cedar

This week we have been planning and drafting our balanced argument on whether it is better to buy local food rather than imported food. In art we have been exploring how to use tone to create a 3D effect.

Sycamore

To celebrate Black History Month we have been looking at the poet Valerie Bloom and analysing her poem 'Welcome'. We discussed the meaning of the poem and how she uses language to create a warm and inviting atmosphere.

Redwood

This week Redwood completed some assessments to prepare them for the SATs in May. We also explored the PANTS rules closely as part of PANTS Week. The children used drama to roleplay different scenarios and discussed what it meant to use and apply the rules in practise.
