How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

We explored the story of 'Harry and his Bucket Full of Dinosaurs' by learning about fewer and more, making fossils, drawing dinosaur features and building a dinosaur skeleton! We thought about how it feels to lose something special.

Maple

Another busy week in Maple class! We began learning our initial sounds in our level 2 Phonics. This week we have learnt: S, A, T, P. Our RE lesson was based around the creation story and we did some beautiful colouring in to show our understanding.

Oak

Oak class have been working very hard! We have written our own adventure stories about woodland creatures playing musical instruments and have been comparing numbers in maths using vocabulary such as greater and less than.

Ash

We sorted plants and animals by habitat and discussed the different features of each. In English we have been writing up our brilliant independent letters. We enjoyed our paper collage art lesson and learning about the equator in geography!

Willow

Willow began working on their own narratives, based on the story 'Stone Age Boy'. They will be written up into their 'First of the Month' books and we are sure you will enjoy reading them at Parent Consultations in October!

Cedar

Cedar have been drafting their independent writing inspired by the Disney short film Feast, as well as being creative by learning the techniques of collage and layering as part of the whole school art project. In science they have been exploring animal diets.

Sycamore

We explored how to clean dirty water by making our own water filters. Using a mixture of materials, we managed to turn muddy water into clear, clean water—just like real scientists! In History we examined different historical sources about the Vikings.

Redwood

In RE, we learned about baptism as an important Christian sacrament. The children explored infant and believer's baptisms, comparing their similarities and differences. In Geography, Redwood studied how birth and death rates affect a country's population and used this knowledge to calculate population growth.
