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How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

We enjoyed learning the actions for the rhymes; 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 Once I caught a fish alive and 1 potato, 2 potato to support hearing and saying numbers. We also created our own glittery fish and explored how the Rainbow Fish discovered true happiness.

Maple

We went for a walk around the school grounds this week identifying and classifying objects into 'alive', 'used to be alive' and 'never been alive'. In DT we experimented and tested stability.

Oak

This week, Oak Class have been thinking about the seasons in science and the types of weather we would expect in each season. In English, we have been writing wonderful sentences for our story, "The Bear and the Piano".

Ash

We have been learning about Paris landmarks as we begin our fiction text, 'A lion in Paris'. We have read interesting facts, collected many brilliant adjectives and identified France on a map. A great first week!

Willow

Willow have continued learning about the Stone Age. We were amazed to see Skara Brae and the way that the Stone Age houses here resembled the homes we live in now. In Music, we watched a short film, for which we will now be composing our own ballad.

Cedar

We continued our work on place value up to 10,000 by exploring different ways to partition numbers. In Geography, we began our new topic 'Where Does Our Food Come From?' with a focus on how our food choices affect the environment.

Sycamore

This week, we began our exciting new History topic, the Vikings. The children explored when and why the Vikings came to Britain. In Science, the children had fun investigating how to separate a mixture using the method of sieving.

Redwood

This week in PE, Redwood continued to develop their agility through Tag Rugby. In English, we began reading Goodnight Mister Tom by Michelle Magorian and explored how the author uses a variety of sentence structures to create tension and suspense.


