How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

This week in Nursery we have been learning about the Police. We were very surprised to find a crime scene in our home corner on Monday, but we used rhyming clues to find the suspect! We have also had fun rescuing 'people who help us' from ice.

Maple

In History this week we began looking at our family tree to understand the concept of generations and older and younger. In Maths we were adding 1 more than to a number and in English we were introduced to the word 'simile' and began using them.

Oak

Oak Class have been continuing writing their versions of Pinocchio. They have been particularly good at using repetition for effect. In science they have been learning to label their body parts and in history, about toys that their parents might have played with.

Ash

In our Geography lessons we have been learning about our wonderful world. We have discovered one unique feature of each continent, identified whether it is a human or physical feature of our world and talked about its significance. We drew our own pictures of these landmarks.

Willow

This week, Willow have been playing pentatonic scales in Music, developing our shading skills in art and learning more about settlements in Geography! In Maths, we have continued to learn our multiplication and division facts with the help of TTRS.

This week in Year 4, children began their History topic on the Indus Valley civilisation, using maps to locate where it would have been and explore reasons why people settled there. They also started planning and designing electrical posters in D&T.

This week we have been looking at the ceremonies children have if born into a hindu family, started reading our new Roman adventure book - *Theives of Ostia*, learnt to write numbers in binary and created a figure drawing in the style of Charlie Mackesy.

This week Redwood travelled to Brunel University to take part in the annual Junior Citizens event. They engaged in a number of workshops where they learned important life skills from members of the Hillingdon Council, London Fire Brigade, Metropolitan Police, the RNLI, NHS and more! It was a fantastic day enjoyed by all.



Thought for the week



While Jesus was praying, heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit came down upon him ... And a voice came from heaven, "You are my own dear Son. I am pleased with you." - Luke 3:21-22

This moment in Jesus' life is often called his baptism, and it tells us something really special: before Jesus began his teaching, before the miracles, before the crowds, God reminded him that he was loved and valued. God didn't say, "I am pleased with you because of what you have done," but simply, "I am pleased with you."

In school, it can be easy for us to think our worth comes from achievements—our test scores, how fast we run, how well we read, or how neat our work looks. But this passage reminds us that God loves us for who we are, not just for what we do. When we make time to pause and pray—like Jesus did—we can be reminded of that same truth: we are deeply loved, known and valued.

Help us to remember that our value does not come from achievements, but from being your children.

As we work, play and learn this week, may we encourage others and help them to feel known and valued too.


