How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

This week, in Nursery, we learnt how being courageous and taking risks can provide learning opportunities and successful outcomes through the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk'.

Maple

Thank you so much for coming and supporting our Nativity this week. The children have worked very hard on it. Elsewhere we have been subitising 1-5 in Maths and starting to make lots of Christmas crafts using our fine motor skills!

Oak

This week has been all about The Nativity and what fun we had! The children worked so hard and should be really proud of themselves. In other news, we wrote our own Queen's Hat stories and learned about waterproof materials in science.

Ash

In history, we were fascinated by the first moon landing and discussed how it was another historically significant moment for aviation. Our Nativity performances were a triumph this week!

Willow

This week, Willow went to the Natural History Museum. We learnt more about our Earth, focusing on volcanoes and earthquakes. We were amazed to see a special suit that could withstand temperatures of up to 1000°C which is worn by scientists.

Cedar

This week, the children built circuits in Science and made switches from card and split pins, testing them and problem-solving when they didn't work. In Maths, they began their second multiplication and division unit, exploring factors to solve multiplication problems.

Sycamore

We have investigated the conductivity of different materials in science, written holiday brochures about life in the Alps, used our descriptive skills to write a narrative about The Snowman in English and developed our perseverance with sewing in DT.

Redwood

This week, Redwood have been writing narratives based on The Firework-Maker's Daughter in our English lessons. In History, the children explored the concepts of continuity and change by examining census data from 1911 and 1921 and making their own inferences.

Thought for the week



Esther was brave and trusted God. She said, "I will go to the king even though it is dangerous. If I die, I die." Esther 4:16

Esther shows us that being brave does not mean never feeling scared. It means choosing to do the right thing, even when it feels hard.

Esther trusted God and stood up for others, knowing it might cost her. Her story reminds us that courage often begins with a small step and a kind heart.

If using a phone, this will download the app. Use the code 3YHEKYFS to access Lets Go Tennis. Either log in to your account if you have booked with us before, or register for a new account if this is your first time.
2. If you need to add a second child to your booking please contact directly
3. Add chosen class to basket and check out
4. Once the payment has been made you will receive a confirmation email and shortly after you will be contacted to sign up to the portal where you will be able to view term dates and skill sets. Once done, you will be able to access the portal both on computer and via app to view class dates, weekly assessment results and invoices.

All sessions are run by LTA qualified coaches who are DBS checked and first aid trained. All lessons will involve technical and tactical work on all major shots as well as match play where possible. 
