How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

This week, we practised counting forwards and backwards using the 'Five Little Ducks' rhyme. We also learnt about the festival of Diwali and made divas and decorated rangoli.

Maple

In Maple class this week we began looking at simplifying our numbers and learning new vocabulary. In RE we spoke about why it is important to thank God for everything we have and thought about what acts of kindness we could do for others.

Oak

Oak Class finished their sporting biographies of Simone Biles. We also learned to perform a Valerie Bloom poem 'Best Friends', as part of our work for Black History Month. In science we went on a tree hunt, looking for deciduous and evergreen trees.

Ash

Ash Class have been eager and excited about starting whole-class recorder lessons! We have focussed on holding the instrument correctly and producing a good, clear sound. We have also learnt to read and repeat simple rhythms and feel the beat.

Willow

Willow have been busy this week. In Science we made presentations about the nutrients found in different food sources, in Music we performed the ballad we wrote together and in History we compared life in the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages.

Cedar

In Year 4, the children have been mapping and calculating the food miles of various products they have eaten. They have also explored the story of Ruth and Naomi to deepen their understanding of selflessness and sacrifice.

Sycamore

In English, we wrote our own narrative poems inspired by The Highwayman, focusing on vivid imagery and rhythm. In History, we explored the many achievements of the Vikings and in DT we continued developing our prototypes for our ROAR projects.

Redwood

This week Redwood wrote their second narrative based on the story Rose Blanche. In Reading, we have been reading Goodnight Mister Tom, where children displayed their empathy for the young protagonist, William Beech. In Art, the children made and decorated their own poetry books.

Something to pray


Dear God,


