How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

We explored activities linked to the 'Little Red Hen' by making playdough bread and developed our imaginative play by creating farm buildings; whilst working collaboratively. We made repeating patterns using conkers, leaves and pinecones.

Maple

This week in Maple we had a teddy bears picnic in Maths, looking at how different size bears would eat different size foods. In English we were looking at instructions and deciding what our teacher needed to get ready for school.

Oak

This week Oak class visited church to find out more about harvest, the seasons of the church and how the church is looking after creation. Children have also been learning to find number bonds systematically and about Florence Joyner's early life.

Ash

In music we moved to the beat by jumping into hoops at the right time! In science we learnt about different climates and linked this to our learning about Kenya in English and about the equator in geography. We went outside to feel and describe the temperature and weather.

Willow

This week, Willow have begun learning about Skara Brae - a Stone Age settlement located in the Orkney Isles. As well as supporting our work in History, we are also reading a text entitled 'Skara Brae' in English.

Cedar

In English, we continued examining the features of a balanced argument by debating whether we should feed animals in our national parks and in Science, we deepened our understanding of food chains, learning more about the roles of predator, prey, and producer.

Sycamore

In English, we began writing poems based on the narrative poem The Highwayman and in Science, we carried out an investigation to find out whether temperature affects the speed at which sugar dissolves.

Redwood

This week Year 6 used drama to explore a character's internal motivation. They also researched invertebrates in Science and explored the similarities and differences in the characteristics of species.
