How we have flourished this week!

Seedlings and Acorns

This week, in Nursery we have been developing the language of size; large, medium and small through the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We practised counting and saying our numbers to 10.

Maple

This week in Maple we began looking at the concept of 1 more and 1 less in Maths. In RE we were learning about the Nativity and wondering how people prepare for the birth of a baby.

Oak

This week, Year One have started to write a list poem about Fireworks night, started learning about subtraction and its relationship to addition and thought about the good news that the angel brought to Mary and Joseph in RE.

Ash

We have started exploring the history of aviation in our new topic, 'How did we learn to fly?'. We made brilliant paper helicopters. In science, we went for a minibeast hunt, searching for microhabitats in the playground and were surprised to find a lot!

This week has been full of new topics, books and learning. In English, we have begun looking at a wordless book entitled 'Flood' which links to our learning in Geography about natural disasters and in music, we will be creating our own compositions.

This week, the children have started their new topic, exploring how children's lives have changed in Britain, with a focus on continuity and change over time. In Mathematics, they have been investigating the concept of area.

Sycamore

This week the children thoroughly enjoyed presenting their ROAR project ideas on how they could change the world. Their ideas were unique, inspiring, and thought-provoking. Well done, everyone.

Redwood

This week Redwood visited Emmanuel Church to learn more about Remembrance Sunday. We read some stories of fallen soldiers from the local area and heard from a member of Emmanuel Church who also serves as a lieutenant colonel in the Armed Forces.
