

## The school aims

To create a stimulating and secure environment which encourages every child to play a full and active part in his or her learning. At the same time as implementing the National Curriculum orders, the school provides structured and relevant experiences which match the needs of each individual and promote their development socially, intellectually, emotionally, spiritually, and physically.

To establish close links with all parents and encourage them to work in partnership with the school. Parents will be kept fully informed about their child's own progress and educational developments. Mutually beneficial relationships are encouraged with members of the local community, the church, Hillingdon Local Education Authority, the London Diocesan Board for Schools and any other support agencies.

## In order to fulfil our aims, staff and governors will work to provide:

- An open welcoming and inclusive environment where queries, questions or concerns are dealt with promptly.
- A broad and balanced curriculum which enables all children to achieve their best and to develop a love of learning.
- A range of activities and tasks which enable parents to support their children's academic performance at home.
- A secure and safe environment for all children, where good behaviour and self-discipline is positively encouraged.
- Opportunities for parents both formally and informally to discuss their children's progress and annual written reports.
- Opportunities for parents to become fully involved in the life of the school through participation in a wide range of school activities.

## Rights and responsibilities


Our school community is made up of all members of staff, children, families, visitors to the school and Holy Trinity Church.

So, many hearts make a school.


**The governors and staff ask families to help us achieve our aims for the school by:**


